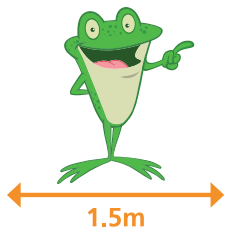


Carlile COVID-19 Protocols

At Carlile Swimming we've always maintained the highest standards of hygiene. We use the latest air and water filtration technologies and our chlorine treatment, together with our added UV filtration system, provides a double layer of protection in the water.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

- We will practice social distancing on the pool deck and within open areas.
- We will practice social distancing in classes when adults are participating.
- We will continue to hold and support children when needed for safety and instruction.



HYGIENE

- Hand sanitisers will be available in all swim schools.
- We are reducing contact at check in.
- Surfaces will be regularly disinfected throughout the day.
- Our cleaning professionals will do a deep clean each evening.



LIMITING NUMBERS

- Please just one carer per child inside the swim school.
- Wherever possible, we request that non-swimming siblings don't attend classes.
- You can check in older children and wait outside to collect them after their lesson.
- We encourage you to 'wrap and go' your child to limit numbers in the change rooms.



HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Staff members who show symptoms won't return to work until they're given the all clear.
- If you or your child shows any symptoms, please don't attend your class.
